

# Soy sourcing data

**LDC has 100% traceability to farm for its direct suppliers in the Soft Commodities Forum's 25 priority municipalities. LDC's origination profile is largely concentrated in the states of Paraná, Goiás and Mato Grosso, where LDC's 3 crushing plants are located.**

LDC has a minority stake (33%) in ALZ Graos, a company operating in the MATOPIBA region. LDC and partners are working with the company to upgrade its sustainability policy and underpinning processes. In 2019, LDC launched a preferential financing line, conditional on strict environmental criteria and supported by WWF, to encourage

farmers to expand over degraded land or pasture, so as to avoid further loss of native vegetation.

We aim to attain full traceability to farm level for all our direct soy purchases in Brazil by 2020, with an initial focus on higher priority regions.

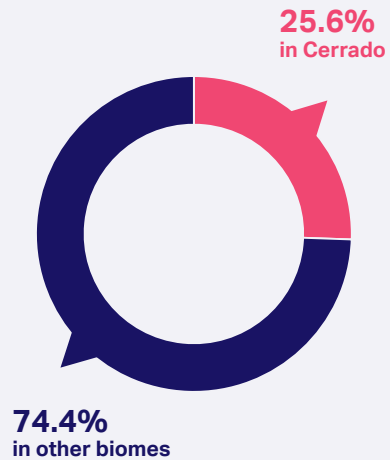

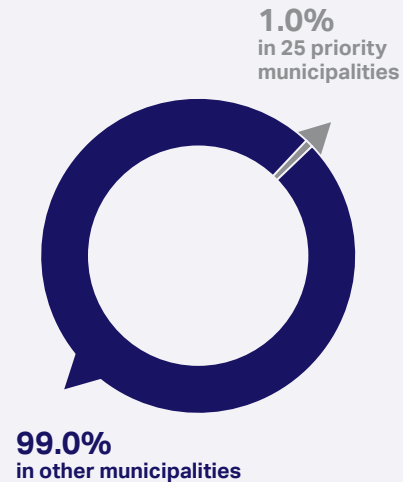

### Soy volume sourced in Brazil\*

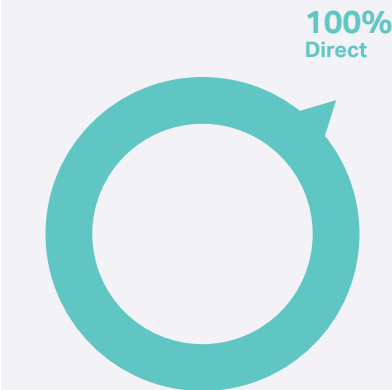


\*not including the minority stake in the JV
